
I am ordering that, effective immediately, all churches and offices of parishes throughout the Diocese of Lubbock are to remain closed until further notice.

No priests are to make themselves available to hear Confessions; the diocesan website has helpful resources for making an Act of Perfect Contrition when unable to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation.

Due to the nature of this order, only people who reside on parish property are allowed to gather; this means that Permanent Deacons are not allowed to travel to their parishes.

I have received a “waiver” that will allow me to make my way to the Cathedral in order to remain visible to our people.
